

Council Vacancy Announced

Application Deadline:
July 26, 5p.m.

At the June 10 City Council meeting, Councilor Terry Weiss submitted her resignation. Ms. Weiss began her first term in office earlier this year. She announced that she would be moving out of town.

The Council invites interested citizens to submit applications to fill the vacancy. Applications will be accepted until 5:00 p.m. on July 26. Applicants will be invited to attend the August 12 City Council meeting for brief interviews before making an appointment to fill the term through December 31, 2019.

Eligibility requirements to serve on the City Council are: 1) Must be a registered voter; 2) Must have resided within the city limits the six months immediately preceding appointment.

Public Hearing Rescheduled

The public hearing for the development at 617 N 19th Street, PC19-02, has been rescheduled for July 15, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall, 980 Applegate St. Scott Lepman Company has proposed to develop a flex space business park, self-storage facility, and RV park.

Utility Rates Adjusted

The Philomath City Council has adopted water fees effective July 1, 2019.

As planning moves forward for construction of a new water treatment facility in 2021, water rates will be increased incrementally over the next three years. As of July 1, the residential water base fee adjusts to \$19.00 per month with a unit increase of 70 cents per unit to \$5.10 per unit. Each unit is 748 gallons. An average family using 8 units per month will see an increase of \$10.60 per month. Recognizing that the increases required for the new facility are significant, the Council kept the sewer, storm drain, and street utility fees unchanged.

The City Council also renewed the General Fund Fee for the next fiscal year at \$10.00 per month, noting the fee is identified as a goal in the Strategic Plan to maintain a healthy budget and current service levels.
