Linn-Benton Neighborhood Emergency Training, or “LB-NET,” is a program that helps neighborhoods organize their own disaster response teams to assist them in the first critical hours of a disaster, when emergency services may be unavailable. Neighbors serving on these teams facilitate communication with officials for the entire neighborhood; assess and report damages; provide basic first aid and sheltering; check on and care for children, shut-in, and disabled neighbors; attend to family pets and anything else that the neighborhood feels should be provided for. The presentation that will provide important emergency preparedness information and get neighborhoods started on this important work will last approximately 1 1/2 hours. The LB NET program works well with Neighborhood Watch or a Neighborhood Association if you have one, or may be organized independently.
